## MORE LOCALS IN MILL PARK GET BACK TO WORK

Friday 15 May, 2020

Local people who have lost work due to the coronavirus pandemic will have the chance to win new jobs in the campaign to help slow the spread of the virus and support the community, under the Andrews Labor Government's *Working for Victoria* initiative.

City of Whittlesea is one of the first 28 councils to sign up to the Labor Government's \$500 million program and will offer 264 positions.

More than 2,300 workers across the state will perform roles such as public asset cleaning and maintenance of parks, gardens and sporting fields.

Other roles will involve outreach to older or isolated people, assisting with immunisation programs and coordinating and distributing food and essential supplies.

Council workers who have been stood down may be redeployed into these new roles.

Working for Victoria is matching thousands of Victorians who have lost their job due to the coronavirus crisis with employers that need workers.

More than 2,750 Victorians have started in new roles since the fund launched in April. The initiative also provides people with access to training where required to take on new positions.
